Minutes

19:00 Meeting started.

832 Declarations of interest received.

All Council agreed to let Chairman B. Sugg continue to Chair the meeting when these matters were discussed.

Minutes were approved as an accurate and correct record of the Parish Council meeting, held on 9th March, 2016 all Council agreed. Chairman B. Sugg and Clerk signed the minutes in the presence of Council.

834 Public Question Time

- (1) Members of the Public
 - a. Mrs A. Hartley took the floor to express her strong feelings towards the conservation area project being included in the NP. She urged Council to have SSDC investigate the conservation area as it was out of her hands now as she had resigned from the Working Group for NP.
 - b. Mr Prior felt that the planning application, 835 (e) was inappropriate to bring a business into the area. The kennels would cause noise. Ms Sally Wood asked what it is going to be used for. It would be overlooking properties. There wasn't any planning for a commercial business.
 - c. Mr Williams spoke regarding the planning application 835(e). There will be another 100 metre filing access and a pedestrian link into the Camp Road. This will be a continuous footpath.
- (2) Mr Steve Joel, Senior Lead Officer SSDC Westlands Regeneration Project. Mr Joel informed council that the Westlands Leisure Centre will be significant. It will have the largest conference floor space. The recuse package is between the District Council, Town Council and Augusta Westlands. The centre needs modernisation. They already have Yeovil Town Council and 2 parishes willing to contribute to the regeneration. Mr Joel showed the Council the new designs. They are hoping to proceed with the works in June 2016.
 - Cllr. J. New asked why not reopen as soon as possible and carry out a refurbishment in stages, by opening one bar whilst refurbishing the other. Mr Joel said that it would be more expensive.
 - Cllr. P. Hodge asked what if the 5 year forecasting wasn't correct. Mr Joel said that they are only looking for an annual commitment.

Cllr. B. Hartley, while he supported the regeneration project, he does not agree that the Parish should contribute to it out of its precept. He felt it could be met by CIL contributions.

Cllr. D. Mead asked why only Area South Parishes asked for a contribution. Mr Joel informed council that it was felt that Area South would be the main users.

Mr Joel informed council that it would not be in competition with the Octagon.

It was decided by all Council to bring this item forward to the next meeting for discussion and resolution.

19:30 Mr S. Joel left the meeting.

(3) Mr Simon Williams / Ms J Widdecombe gave a presentation on Neighbourhood Plan, starting with a brief history of the NP.

It has to be a land use plan. Has to be in conformity with the Local Plan.

District Council have the draft and the steering group are waiting for a confirmation that it doesn't need a strategic development assessment.

The next stage will be consultation with the public, and then formally submit it to South Somerset. They then arrange for an examiner to write a report. Then a referendum to all parishioners. All parishioners have a right to vote. As long as 50% of them vote yes, then it is adopted.

They are trying to reflect what local people have said. They are not allocating sites for development but will use criteria policies. Local Green Space areas are already protected.

It was asked if the Parish would have to find development, and Council were informed that they don't have to. Cllr. D. Mead asked if they didn't get a 50% yes vote, what would happen. Mr Williams informed council that that has never happened before. Cllr. M. Shepstone informed council that the District Council would do the referendum.

Ms J. Widdecombe told council that there would be a meeting to discuss further issues on NP on Monday 18th April.

- D. Cllr. G. Seaton said well done to the Council for doing the NP plan and progressing with it.

Proposal: Application to discharge Section 52 agreement dated 5tgh November 1981 between Yeovil District Council and Raymond John Dodge relating to planning permission 810279 regarding agricultural tie and non fragmentation

Location: Fairwind Burton lane, East Coker

Resolution: All council agreed that they required a detailed planning application for the entire site before they could consider the application to discharge the Section 52 agreement in respect of the agricultural tie and non-fragmentation.

Proposal: Application to fell 1 No. Cypress tree, Leylandii trees and to carry out tree surgery works to various Cypress trees all within a designated conservation area

Location: Helyar Arms.

Resolution: This work has already been carried out but it was proposed by Vice Chair. J. Bennett and seconded by Cllr. M. Shepstone to have appropriate re planting after consulting with the arborist. A vote was taken and all agreed with the exception of 1 councillor.
